

### LOAVES AND FISHES FOOD PANTRY The pantry is now open on WEDNESDAY from 9:00am to 5:00pm

This change in day and time allows us to streamline shopping, shelf stocking, volunteers, and paperwork. It also allows those who work to use the pantry when needed and we can now utilize the gifts of our local students to help. If you would like to volunteer, there is a sign-up sheet in the kitchen with shifts for every Wednesday. We seek to have three or more people working each shift.

You can also help by donating any of the following items: Elbow macaroni, spaghetti, pasta sauce, tuna, peanut butter, grape or strawberry jam, instant oatmeal, rice crispy's, cheerios, canned beets, corn or beans, canned fruit cocktail or peaches, boxed macaroni and cheese, ramen noodles, pasta sides or packets of instant potatoes, creamed or tomato soup. You may leave any of these items in the kitchen.

If you prefer, monetary donations can be made out to the FPRC with Loaves and Fishes in the memo line. Place those donations in the offering plate.

We are grateful for the many who are volunteering and donating to make this ministry so successful. Please prayerfully consider how you can make a difference by pitching in with us at the pantry.

On another Pantry note, the Montgomery County Office of the Aging is moving the Fort Plain Food Pantry from The Fort Plain Senior Center to **28 Church Street**. It will be open **every 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Monday from 9am to 2pm**.

# Dear Sisters and Brothers,

We shared in the Winter Newsletter that the consistories of Fort Plain and Sprakers have been in conversation about formalizing our shared ministry by covenanting as a Multi-Parish ministry. With the help of the Schenectady Classis, we have developed a Multi-Parish agreement and are ready to move forward.

The consistories have continued to discuss how to envision our future ministry together as we share Pastor Ryan as our Minister of Word and Sacrament and as we grow our outreach and mission in the Mohawk Valley.

Our Multi-Parish agreement around sharing the services of Pastor Ryan includes sharing the expense of having a full-time pastor; collaboration on special worship services; and shared mission and ministry opportunities as they present. We believe this agreement will not only help both of our congregations to continue to engage in ministry, but to position us to thrive as we navigate the changing culture, church, community, and world around us. This agreement has grown out of years of prayer, learning, and listening to the Spirit.

In some ways nothing is really changing. Pastor Ryan is the installed pastor at Fort Plain, and the supervising pastor at Sprakers and we do share much of the pastoral services of her calling. However, nothing has been codified, in writing, or formally approved by our Classis of Schenectady. This agreement makes it formal and a visible sign of our desire to follow where Christ is leading our two congregations and our ministry. Once fully approved, Pastor Ryan will be installed at Sprakers.

We have tried to keep both congregations in the loop of our conversations, and some of you have asked us some good questions and helped us to polish our agreement so that it truly reflects our ministry together. Thank you for that. We want to offer you an opportunity to ask any other questions and to give us your support. To this end, we ask you to stay after church on Sunday, June 2 for feedback. If you are unable to make that please feel free to speak with any consistory member or put a question in writing in the offering plate before the June 2<sup>nd</sup> worship.
